Undergraduate degree in Economics (Taught in English) at the Sorbonne School of Economics

- The Sorbonne School of Economics is launching a new **Undergraduate degree program in Economics**. It is a **national degree (Licence Economics) fully taught in English**, designed for both French and international students. This program will welcome **250 students in the first year** and offers a unique opportunity to study Economics at one of France's top universities, with affordable tuition fees.



What to expect from the program?

Program Overview

Benefit from a fully taught English bachelor's program without the high cost for a quality education in Economics. Study right in the center of Paris at the countries leading Economics department.

The Licence Economics – International Track is an **Undergraduate degree in Economics**. It is a new track within the existing undergraduate degree of Economics program at the Sorbonne School of Economics. It will be available through the French University application platform **Parcoursup**, alongside the general Economics track. The general track will have a capacity of 500 students, while the **International track** will host **250 students**.

This program supports the university's strategy to expand its international offerings and meet the growing demand for **high-quality, English-taught programs** in

Economics. It allows students to pursue an international education **without the high costs** of studying abroad. The **tuition fees** are set at **national rates**, making it accessible to a broad range of students.

Key Benefits of the Program

International Focus: Gain a global perspective on Economics with courses fully taught in English.

Affordable Tuition: Enjoy reduced tuition fees compared to international programs, with fees aligned to French national rates (around €175/year + CVEC* for French and European students).

Career Preparedness: Develop the skills needed for a global career by studying and working in English.

Accessibility for All: This program offers an international education at a fraction of the cost of studying abroad.

Mobility Opportunities: While international study is encouraged, it is not mandatory, ensuring that all students, regardless of financial background, can participate.

UNA Europa Certifications: The degree allows students to obtain (in addition) the UNA Europa certificate in European Studies or the UNA Europa Microcredentials in Sustainability. UNA Europa is an alliance of 11 European universities.

*The CVEC (Contribution Vie Étudiante et de Campus) is a mandatory fee in France that students must pay to support campus life, services, and student welfare.

Courses Offered

English speakers will have access to French as a Foreign Language (FLE) courses to help them adapt to studying in France.

The courses offered in the International track will align with the content of the general Economics track but will be taught entirely in English. Students will have several minor options to choose from, including:

- European Studies Certificate (offered by UNA europa)
- A minor taught in French (management, geography, law, philosophy, sociology, history)
- A second foreign language
- Microcredentials on Sustainability (offered by UNA Europa)

- Additionally, non-French speakers will have access to **French as a Foreign Language (FLE)** courses to help them adapt to studying in France.

Language and Mobility

English speakers will have access to French as a Foreign Language (FLE) courses to help them adapt to studying in France.

- Students should have a **minimum B2 level in English**. The goal is to **bring them to a level C1/C2**.
- Students will have the option to take **specialized English-language courses like Economic English**. Specific support will be provided for students with limited skills in English
- The **program encourages international mobility** during the second or third year, but this is not mandatory. With numerous international agreements in place, students can **choose from 98 destinations** for **exchange programs**.

What you should provide to apply:

- High school results, high school diploma (if obtained). English language certificate (optional for students applying on Parcoursup).
