LICENCE OF ECONOMICS - INTERNATIONAL TRACK

OBJECTIVES

The Licence of Economics (Bachelor's Degree in Economics) - International Track, taught entirely in English, offers an undergraduate education in economics, combining theoretical and quantitative approaches with an emphasis on social sciences and international perspectives.

This program provides:

- A solid preparation for master's degrees in economics, particularly those taught in English.
- An international outlook.
- Enhanced language skills (English, second foreign language) and French as a Foreign Language courses for non-French speakers.

APPLICANT PROFILE

This program is open to both French and international students who hold a high school diploma (Baccalauréat or equivalent) and have a minimum English proficiency level of B2.

LANGUAGE AND MOBILITY

- **Required English level** : B2, with a target of C1/C2 by the end of the program.
- **Specialized courses in English** (ex. written and oral communication, methodology) and support for students who need assistance.
- International mobility encouraged in the 2nd or 3rd year with access to 98 exchange destinations.

Study at one of the top universities in France, in the heart of Paris, and benefit from:

- **Courses taught in English**: A high-quality education at an affordable cost.
- International mobility opportunities: 98 destinations thanks to our strong network of partner universities. Possibility of earning a double degree with the University Complutense of Madrid.

MAIN CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

This undergraduate degree opens doors to a variety of careers in finance, economic analysis, market research, public administration, international organizations, and consulting.

Graduates acquire key skills in :

- **Economic analysis** : Collecting, processing, and interpreting data.
- **Modeling** : Using tools to analyze markets and behaviors.
- **Communication** : Writing and presenting information in a clear and structured manner.
- **Critical thinking** : Evaluating economic policies and theories.
- **Collaboration** : Working in teams on multidisciplinary projects.
- **Digital tools** : Mastering statistical software and databases.
- International environment : Navigating professional settings in an international environment and in English.

- Via Parcoursup : January 15 -- March 13, 2025 (for French and European applicants)
- Via DAP ou Études en France : October 1 December 15, 2024 (for international applicants)

PROGRAM CAPACITY

EXAMPLE OF COURSES OFFERED

First Year (L1)

<u>Semester 1 :</u> Introduction to Economics, Economic History, Mathematics: Initiation to Economics,

Descriptive Statistics, Introduction to Sustainability (UNA Europa).

<u>Semester 2 :</u> Microeconomics I, Comparative Economic Theories, International Economics, Mathematics for Economists, Social Protection.

Second Year (L2)

<u>Semestre 3</u>: Macroeconomics (Closed Economy), Microeconomics (Market Failures), Taxation and Fiscal Economics, Probability, European Culture and Societies (UNA Europa).

<u>Semester 4</u>: Macroeconomics (Open Economy), European Economics and Policies, Growth and Crises, Economic Dissertation and Data Writing.

Third Year (L3)

<u>Semester 5</u>: Economic Growth, Uncertainty and Information, Sustainable Development Economics, History of Economic Thought, Econometrics.

<u>Semester 6 :</u> International Trade, Organization Theory and Markets, Public Economics, Environmental Economics, Bachelor Thesis or Internship.

Students can also choose **minor courses** in various disciplines such as **management**, **law**, **philosophy**, **or sociology**, and take optional bonus courses (**languages**, **theater**, **sports**, **social engagement**). Minor courses are typically taught in French. Advanced courses in Semester 6 prepare students for further specialization in diverse master's programs.
